Mocean Dance, a professional contemporary dance company based in Kjipuktuk/Halifax, Nova Scotia, is seeking an Interim Artistic Producer (IAP) to cover a maternity leave for one of Mocean's two Co-Artistic Directors. The IAP will work collaboratively with the Co-Artistic Director, Administrative Associate and the Board of Directors to implement the current and upcoming seasons, in line with Mocean's artistic vision. Arts administrators, arts general managers and dance artists with administrative experience are encouraged to apply.

The Interim Artistic Producer will be focused on providing support in the areas of:

- Project, tour and production management
- Professional Development
- Education, Outreach and Community Engagement

They will also provide support to the staff in the areas of:

- Grant applications and reporting
- Marketing and communication
- Fundraising and revenue generation

The ideal candidate should possess a university or community college degree, or relevant professional experience.

Other requirements include:

- Excellent computer skills and proficiency in MS Office, Google Suite
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Experience in program development and implementation, grant writing and report writing
- Attention to details and strong analytical and research skills
- Ability to work both independently and as a team player
- Ability to learn new processes and systems quickly
- Time management and ability to prioritize, manage multiple tasks, and meet tight deadlines
- Exceptional work ethic, interpersonal skills, and professionalism
- Knowledge and understanding of the arts and the nonprofit sector

Knowledge and experience in contemporary dance and in particular the Atlantic Dance community, experience with community work, inclusion and diversity training, familiarity with website and social media marketing; non-profit board experience; valid Driver's license and access to a vehicle when required, and knowledge of both written and spoken French; as well as specialized training in arts administration will be considered assets.

Professional dance artists with experience in arts administration are encouraged to apply. In addition to the above responsibilities, there is an option to participate in artistic activities as part of the job responsibilities and can be tailored to the individual's interests and skill sets.

Possible activities include: performing, teaching, rehearsal direction, mentorship. Applicants are encouraged to outline their artistic skill sets in their applications. Some flexibility to the work schedule may be available to artists who are already committed to artistic projects during the tenure of this contract.

We welcome and strongly encourage people from all communities and intersecting identities to apply. This includes Indigenous people, LGBTQ+ & Two-Spirit people, Black people and people of colour.
